# Eligible Cost

Eligible costs are those that are required for carrying out the project activities and are incurred by the applicant and their partners. They must:

- Comply with the principles of sound financial management, in particular value for money and cost effectiveness, as outlined in the Grant Implementation Guidelines;
- Reflect market prices; and
- Be recorded in the applicants' accounts, be identifiable and verifiable and be backed up by original supporting documents.



# Ineligible Cost

- Field activities taking place outside of Cambodia
- Stand alone research or data collection that does not clearly address CCCSP priorities
- Ongoing general operating expenses
- Major capital expenditure
- Salaries of civil servants and core office staff
- Fundraising events
- Political campaigns or activities
- Interest owed, debt and provisions for losses
- Purchase of land
- Contingency reserve
- Indirect costs are those costs that are not easily identifiable as exclusively related to a particular project.



# Capacity Assessment

- The objective is to verify the procedures and tools used by the applicant organization are compatible with the CCCA requirements
- The capacity assessment will review of the Financial and Administrative capacities, and Results Based Management capacities of the Applicant organization
- This assessment is also an opportunity to identify possible areas for future capacity building
- Any serious gaps will need to be addressed prior to signature of the LoA
- To confirm payment modalities and schedule, and monitoring arrangements
- To confirm if staffing and partnership arrangements are appropriate.
