Progress report 2021

Sectoral indicators:

Infrastructure- Roads: Length and % of climate proofed roads constructed/Access all year round (116 Km of DBST road constructed in 2021),

Human health: % Households with basic sanitation (11% increase in 2021 from 67% to 78%),

Water resources: % Poor HHs with access to basic water supply services that are available all year round (59.7% in 2021, increase of 1.7%)

NDC actions:

- 1 action under implementation preparation
- 3 actions under implementation:

Finance:

- Conditional (requested) in the updated NDC up to 2030 : 1.4 billion USD
- 2021: 71.7 million USD (MEF, WB, ADB, China Aid)





Implementation in 2021

- Building adaptive and resilient capacity for MRD officers at national and subnational level for mainstreaming climate change into rural development planning processes and technical design
 - BL: 13 officials trained- 175 (50 MRD+125PDRD) by 2030: 50 in 2021 (Kg.cham province)
- Rural road rehabilitation and improvement for climate change resilience
 - BL: 3000 DBST (km)-6000 DBST (km) by 2030, 116 DBST (km) in 2021
- Resilient and adaptive rural water supply and sanitation construction
 - BL: 73% water supply- 90% water supply by 2030: 1.7% water supply in 2021






Cross-cutting issues: 2021

- Technology transfer: yes, available for all actions under implementation
- Gender:
 - 50% project beneficiaries,
 - 50% stakeholders in consultations, training participants on new technologies and adaptive water systems
 - 30%: those who received skills training,
 - 60%: those benefiting from social and economic facilities, observation and consultation, non-motorize road users are majority women. They often use roads to access social and economic facilities.
- Youth engagement:
 - 2/3 actions
 - The youth and children have been involved in road safety campaigns organized by the project after the road constructions.
- Private sector:
 - 2/3 actions
 - design and construction works
- Capacity gaps:
 - More trainings on climate change issues related to the road design and construction needed.

Next steps in 2022

- The action under implementation preparation:
 - Developing a training manual and providing training on approaches for development of climate-smart and sustainable livelihood to rural poor people
- Actions to be initiated:
 - Build adaptive capacity on climate change for village leaders (Village Development Committees, VDCs)
 - Integrated village development
- Challenges and opportunities:
 - Budget is still one of the major problem for us to implement action in NDC and well as in our CC action Plan.
 - Still need more coordination among all activities, programmes within MRD, and NGOs
 - We can see some of the actions, related to rural road improvement and Water Supply is in better position in term of funding, but not enough for other soft component.
