

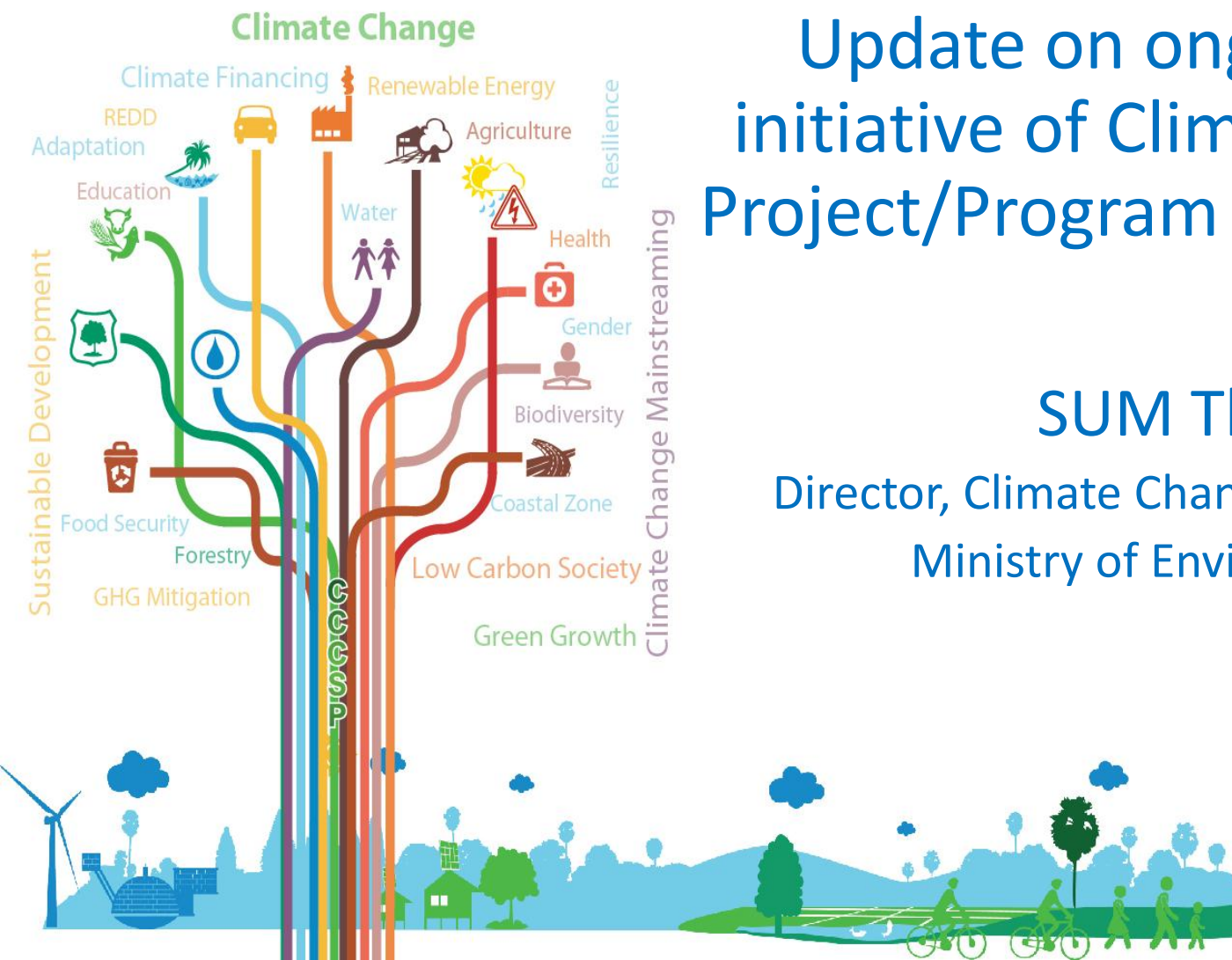

- 6 additional Ministries start preparing CCAP with support from CCCA



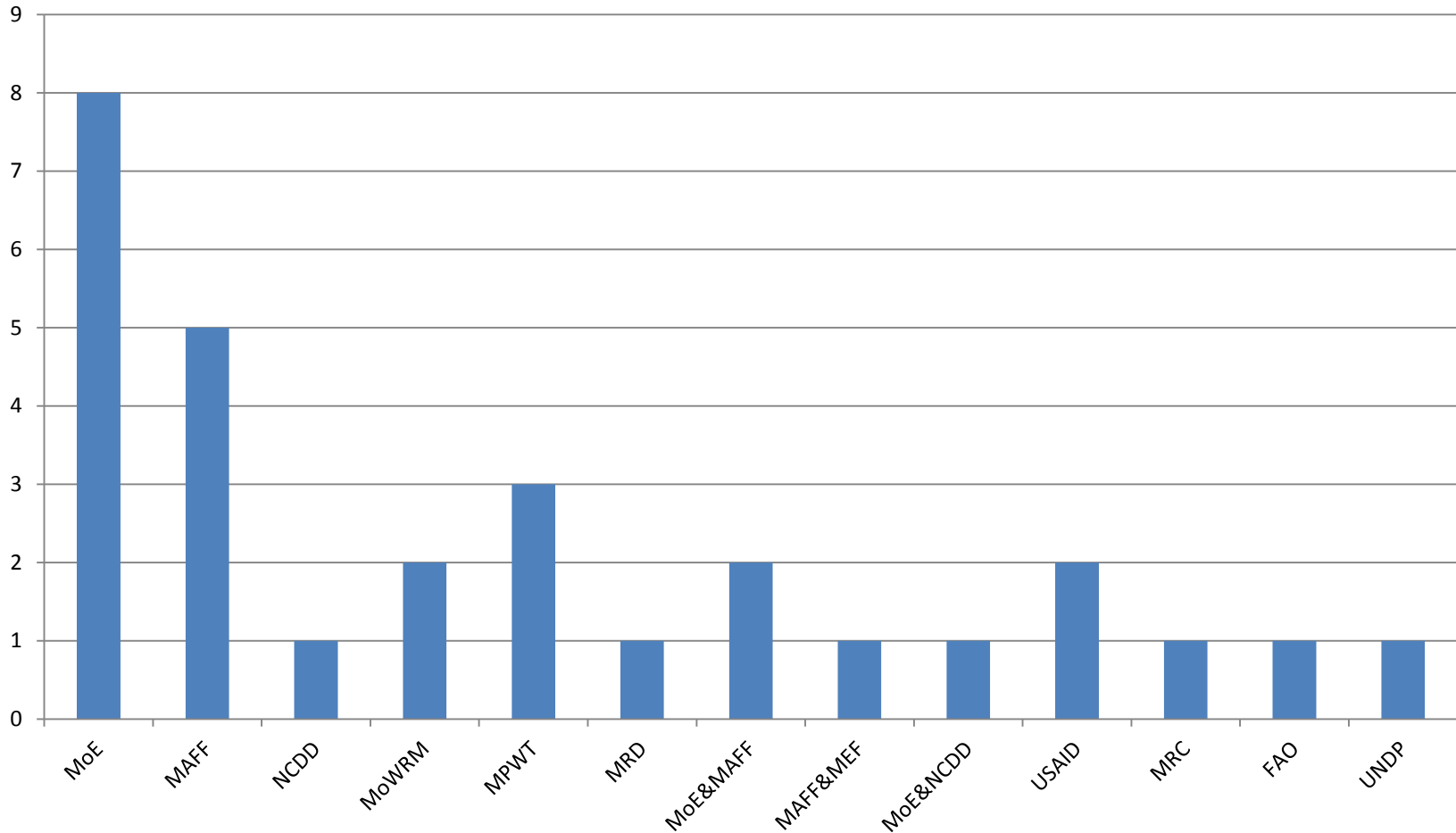

- No information from IFAD. Most activities with MAFF
- Total Budget (rough estimation): USD 248 M (Apro USD 212 M grant)

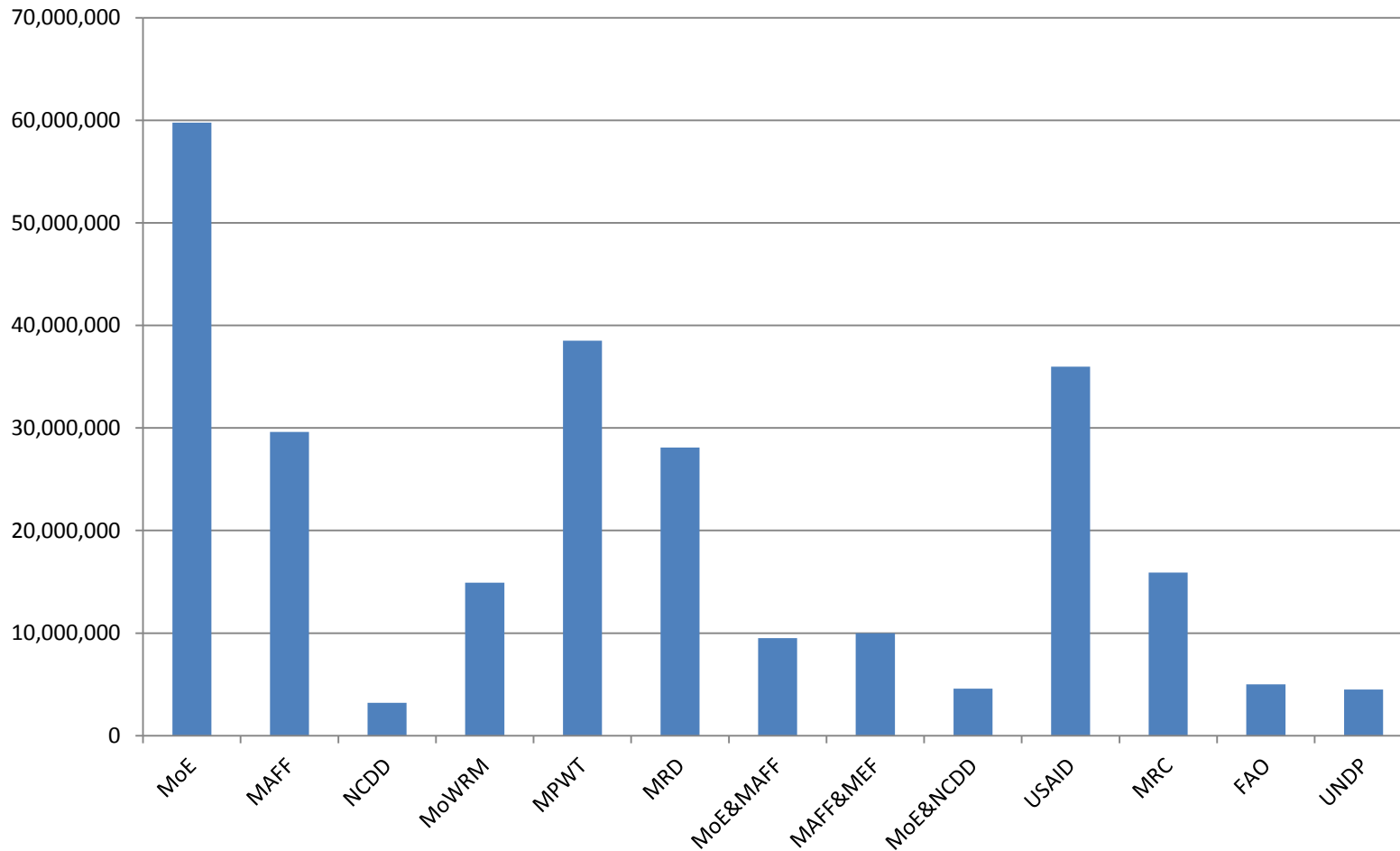

## Project/Program by Ministries/Agencies



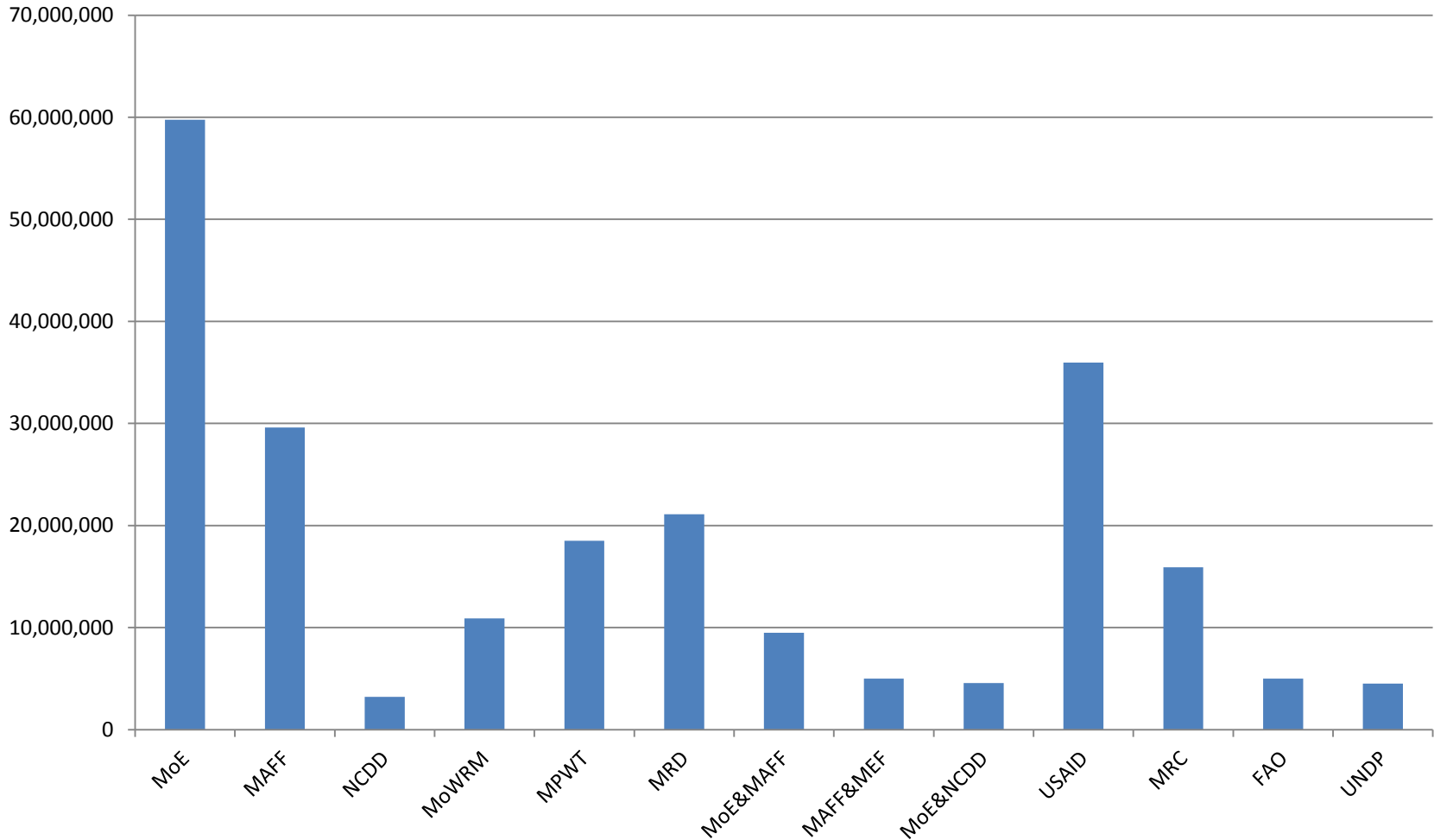
