Objectives PPCR/SPCR

Phase 1:

Assessment and strengthening of institutional readiness for the PPCR/SPCR

Facilitation cross-sectoral dialogue in 3 priority areas (water resources, agriculture and Natural Resources, rural infrastructure development)

Common vision for climate resilience in the medium and long-term 'strategic programme' SPCR

Phase 2:

Implementation of the 'strategic programme' SPCR

3 priority areas

Investment projects with seven components (including policy framwork, institutional capacity building, on-the-ground investments) Collaboration between PPCR and CCCA and key stakeholders

Component 1: National level mainstreaming of climate resilience in key ministries (strengthening institutional readiness to mainstream climate risks)

Component 2: Sub-national mainstreaming of climate resilience

Component 3: Strengthening civil society and private sector engagement and gender considerations in climate change adaptation

Progress PPCR/SPCR

PPCR Phase 2 (SPCR) was approved by PPCR sub-committee in Cape Town, South Africa in June 28.

\$86 million (\$50 million in grant, \$36 million in loan) approved for investment projects in agriculture, water resources, rural infrastructure, TA to the Climate Change Department, including component on civil society platform

Phase 2 will be implemented through ADB.

Good progress in selection of consulting firms mainstreaming climate resilience at national and sub-national levels and on science-based adaptation planning and outreach.

Final selection of 2 firms is expected in next 3-4 months.

Project works closely with the firms to ensure that activities of PPCR Phase 1 are well coordinated with climate change adaptation initiatives, specifically CCCA Selection of individual consultants to carry out the work on private sector, CSOs/NGOs engagement in PPCR by MoE is on-going,

Works start when consultants are on board.
