**Strengthening Children and youth voices in
promoting DRR/CCA and Safe School**



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Rational

- Education has been threatened by several natural and man-made disasters, of which impacts can be devastating, and each context presents different challenges. It tends to have a large impact on operational capacity (IIEP, 2006) in the education sector. Schools are destroyed, education infrastructure are damaged, teachers and students displaced, and informational material lost. Human loss, including the loss of teachers, education policy makers, and the school management personnel, affects institution's capacity and the ability to provide a quality education (Global Education Cluster, 2010: IIEP, 2006). Normal processes of education planning breakdown during an emergency, weakening the overall system and creating future problems in the development of an inclusive educational system (IIEP, 20016).
- So The Safe School Framework has been developed and it is also aligned with the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR).

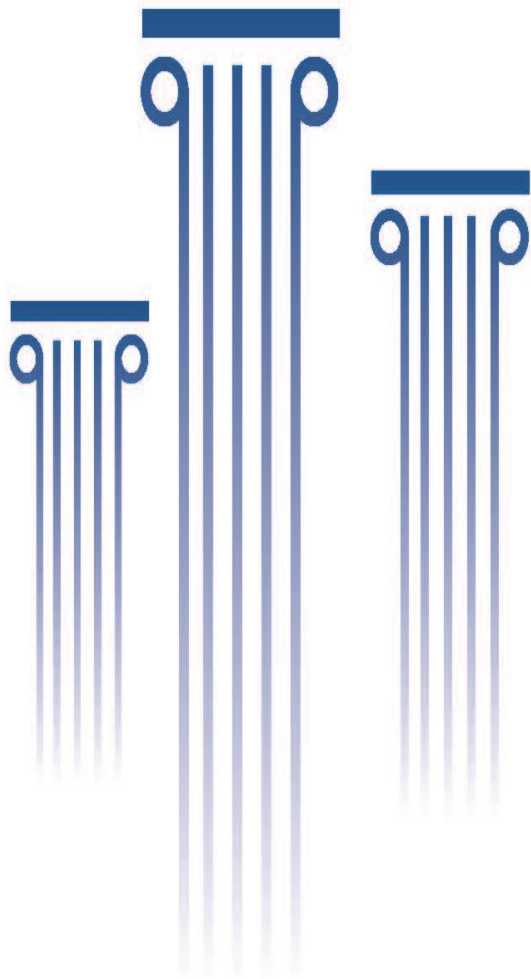


Safe School Introduction

- School safety is attained when children and adults can reasonably expect that they will not be injured or killed on school premises, and that student's continuous access to their right to a free quality basic education is not threatened by known and expected hazards.



Safe School Pillars

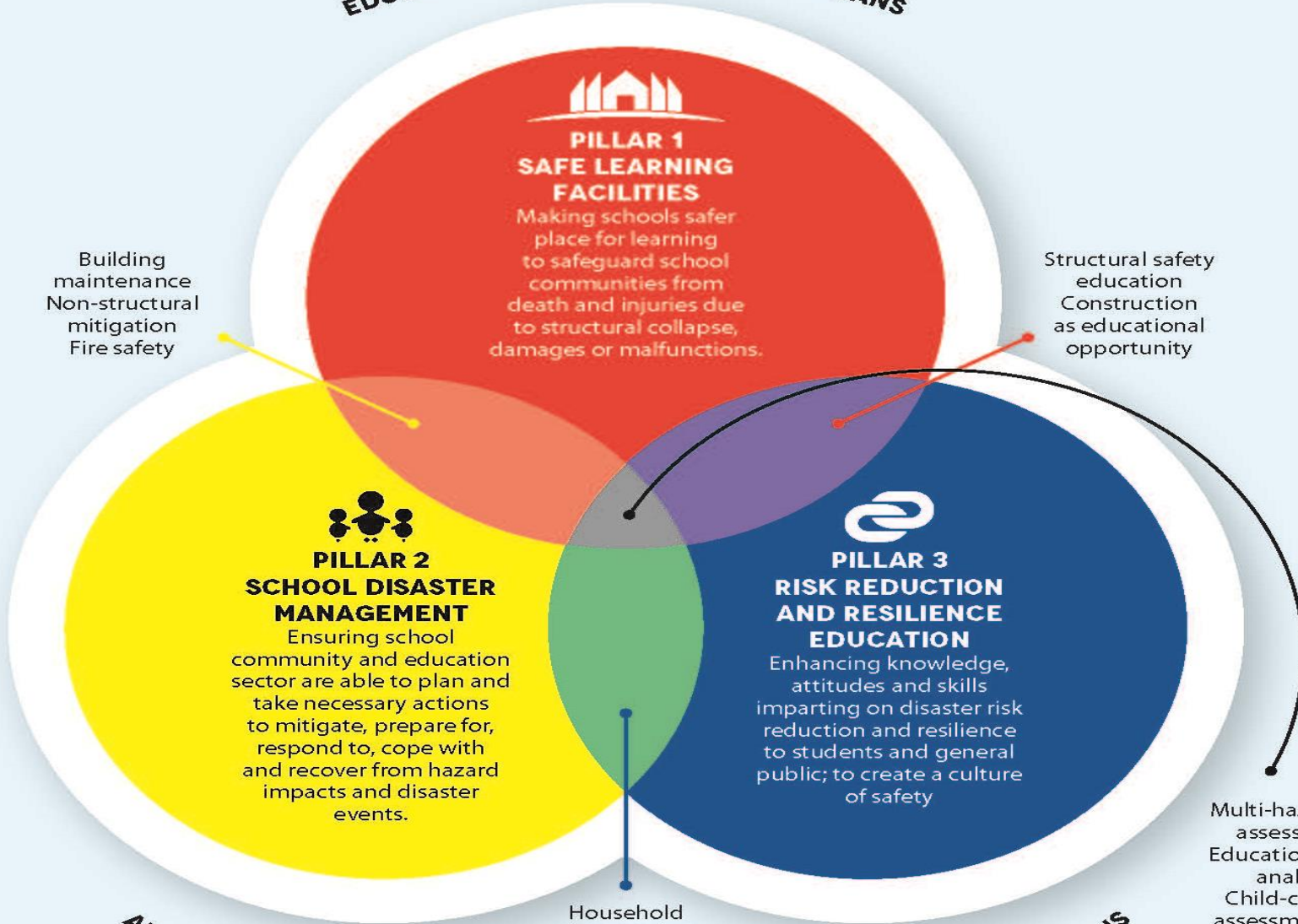


Pillar1: Safe Learning Facilities.

Activities

Sub-national level

- Risk and Hazard were identified by Children and developed DRR action plan for school in target area. Moreover, DRR/CCA and Safe School initiatives were presented to Commune level by students children representative and integrated to CIP
- Students in target school were equipped knowledge on DRR/CCA safe school, search and rescue, first-aid skill and simulation exercise.



Activities at Sub-national level

- Supported to target school for implementing DRR/CCA planning in school to promote school become safer and green for children student.
- Conducted public campaign to promote safe school initiative at sub-national level in target area.
- Facilitated with children and youth student, teacher, school principle and SSC to establish smart agriculture garden for student learning and sharing to community on agri. adaptation technique.
