CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI)

COMMUNITY-BASED CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION GRANTS TO CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS

To promote *mainstreaming climate resilience into development planning,* the Asian Development Bank (ADB Pilot Program for Climate Resilience of the Climate Investment Fund) through **Plan International**, will provide small grants to Cambodian Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) to implement projects on community-based climate change adaptation.

EXTENDED EOI submission deadline: 30 September 2015 (17:00hrs)

Eligibility: Any registered Cambodian Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO),

or Community Based Organisation (CBO).

Applications from coalitions or partnerships highly recommended

(NGO that works together with several CBOs for example).

EOI-Process: Submit brief EOI in English to Plan International by 30 Sept. 2015

include a brief summary of your organization's work

• demonstrate your agency's interest in and capacity to effectively manage a community-based climate change adaptation project

PROPOSALS ARE **NOT** REQUIRED AT THIS TIME

Ensuing process: About 35 applicants will be selected based on EOIs to

participate in a 1 week-long training in October 2015. Only those

CSOs who have completed the training will be invited to

prepare a full project proposal.

Approximately 20 proposals will be subsequently awarded.

Small grant Budget: US\$30,000 - \$100,000 / CSO

Small grant Purpose: Address risks and resilience of communities to climate change.

Location: Anywhere in Cambodia.

Sectors: Any sectors including but not limited to agriculture, water resources,

urban development, or transport.

Preferences: Future proposed projects will be gender-sensitive, participatory,

innovative, and directly improve resilience of vulnerable populations (including women, children, people with disabilities, and minorities).

CSO Grant Period: Maximum 18 months **Grant completion deadline**: December 2017
